
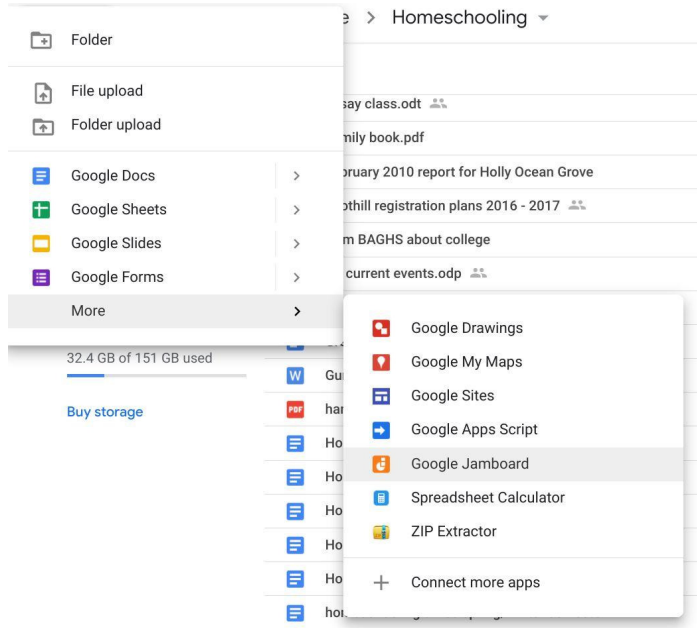




## Jamboard - A Collaborative Virtual Whiteboard

- Jamboard is offered for free by Google.
- You can access it through your Google Drive.  <https://drive.google.com/>
  - Go to <New>, click on it, hover with your mouse over the <More>, and click on <Google Jamboard>. Here you will create a Jamboard directly.

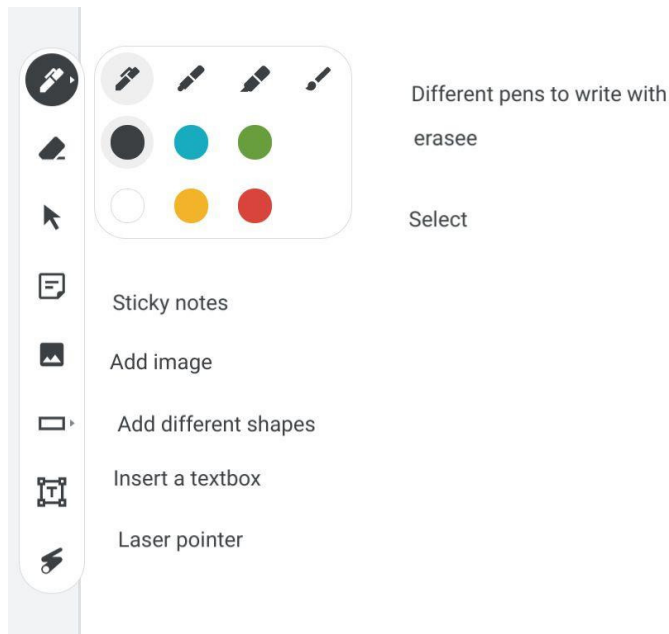


- You can also access Jamboard from your Gmail or Google account <https://www.google.com/> - Click on



the 9 dots Google menu on the top right. Then click on the icon for Jamboard and have access to all the Jamboards you have. Once you are on the Jaboards page, click on the orange

 sign on the bottom right corner to open a new Jamboard.



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- Pros of Jamboard -
  - You can work collaboratively with your student. Share the Jamboard either with a View or Edit permission. I always share it with the Edit option so that we can work together in our sessions.
  - You can work on many subjects and topics, with young and older students.
- Some disadvantages -
  - The student, when they have the edit option, can delete parts of the Jamboard.
  - Currently, the Jamboards are limited to 20 pages. Hopefully, it'll change soon.
  - You can't copy portions of a Jamboard to another one, but you can make a full copy and make edits to the copy.
  - Prep can be time-consuming, especially for younger students, but not unlike other tools.
  - Jamboard is still being changed as a result of remote learning. Some features are available in the Web version but not the App version and vice-versa. For example, File Upload.
